Jeremy Colliton- Head Coach

Jeremy Colliton is in his second season with the IceHogs and is the team's fourth head coach during American Hockey League affiliation and 10th overall in team history by the Chicago Blackhawks on May 17, 2017.

Colliton spent the last four seasons as the head coach of Mora IK in Sweden (HockeyAllsvenskan). A native of Blackie, Alberta, Colliton guided his team to a league-best 35-4-13 record and 105 points during the 2016-17 season. Following the regular season, he led Mora IK to a promotion to the Swedish Hockey League for the 2017-18 season after defeating Leksands IF in six games (4-2) of the best-of-seven series. Colliton joined the coaching ranks with Mora IK in an interim head coaching role during the 2013-14 season before taking over full-time the following season. In four seasons with Colliton behind the bench, Mora IK posted a 98-18-57 record.

Prior to becoming a coach, Colliton had an eight-year professional career primarily in the National Hockey League and AHL. He appeared in 57 NHL games across five seasons (2005-09, 2010-11) with the New York Islanders, notching three goals and three assists. He was originally drafted by the Islanders in the second round (58th overall) of the 2003 NHL Draft.

The 32-year-old also spent parts of six seasons (2005-09, 2010-12) in the AHL with the Bridgeport Sound Tigers, recording 203 points (77G, 126A) in 326 career games. Additionally, he had stints with Rogle Angelholm (2009-10) in the Swedish Elite League and Mora IK (2013-14). He also had experience on the international stage, earning gold and silver medals while representing Canada at the 2005 and 2004 IIHF World U20 Junior Championships, respectively.

Derek King - Assistant Coach

Derek King enters his third season as the assistant coach of the Rockford IceHogs in 2018-19. A native of Hamilton, Ont., King has helped coach the Toronto Marlies (AHL) to one Western Conference Championship and three divisional titles.

Prior to his debut with the IceHogs in 2016-17, King, 49, most recently served as the Assistant Coach of the Owen Sound Attack of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL). Prior to his time in the OHL, King was an assistant and associate coach of the Toronto Marlies from 2009-15. The Toronto Marlies captured the Western Conference Championship in 2012 and won the North Division in 2012, 2013, and 2014. The Marlies collected a combined record of 243-166-26-30 under King's tutelage.

He began his coaching career as a player-assistant coach with the Grand Rapids Griffins, serving in that role in both the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. He collected 22 goals and 49 assists in 136 games with the Griffins.

King was drafted #13 overall by the New York Islanders in the 1985 NHL Entry Draft, and went on to play 14 seasons in the NHL, 11 of those with the team that originally drafted him. The left wing notched 261 goals and 351 assists for 612 points in 830 NHL games. He also accrued 417 PIM. Along with the Islanders (1986-97), King's NHL career includes stops with the Hartford Whalers (1996-97), Toronto Maple Leafs (1997-00), and St. Louis Blues (1999-00). During his final stop with the Blues, he played under current Chicago Blackhawks Head Coach Joel Quenneville.



Sheldon Brookbank - Assistant Coach

Sheldon Brookbank enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Rockford IceHogs during the 2018-19 season.

Brookbank, a Stanley Cup Champion with the Blackhawks in 2013, appeared in 74 games across two seasons (2012-2014) with Chicago, notching eight points (3G, 5A). The 36-year-old is entering the coaching ranks after posting 44 points (7G, 37A) and 473 penalty minutes in 351 career NHL games with the Nashville Predators (2006-07), New Jersey Devils (2007-09), Anaheim Ducks (2009-12) and Blackhawks.

The Lanigan, Saskatchewan, native most recently played in six games during the 2016-17 season with the AHL's Cleveland Monsters where he registered one assist. Brookbank compiled 126 points and 972 penalty minutes during 367 career AHL contests that spanned across parts of eight seasons with the Grand Rapids Griffins, Cincinnati Mighty Ducks, Milwaukee Admirals, Lowell Devils and Monsters. He won the AHL's Eddie Shore Award as the league's best defenseman in 2006-07 with Milwaukee. He also spent one season in the Kontinental Hockey League with Kazan Ak-Bars in 2014-15 and the following season with Liiga's Lukko Rauma.

Samuelsson was originally selected 27th overall by the Arizona Coyotes in the 2012 NHL Draft. The 6-3, 210-lbs forward began the 2017-18 season with the Idaho Steelheads in the ECHL, collecting 43 points (16g, 27a) and 96 penalty minutes in 49 games. He led all Idaho skaters in penalty minutes, ranked second on the team in both points and assists and was tied for fourth in goals.

The Pittsburgh native signed a Professional Tryout (PTO) agreement with the IceHogs on Feb. 11 and scored a goal in each of his first three games with Rockford. As of April 10, Samuelsson has helped the Hogs to a 14-6-1-1 record while logging 11 points (8g, 3a), 16 PIMs and a +2 rating through his 22 total appearances with the team. The forward leads Rockford in goals since making his team debut, and has notched a pair of season high-tying three-game point streaks from March 13-17 and March 23-26.

Samuelsson originally made his professional debut with the Portland Pirates in the AHL during the 2014-15 season. He has combined for 66 points (31g, 35a) and 122 PIMs in 158 career AHL games between Portland (2014-15), Springfield (2015-16), Tucson (2016-17), Bakersfield (2016-17) and Rockford (2017-18). The forward also made his NHL debut with the Coyotes on Feb. 26, 2015 at the New York Rangers and has skated in three NHL games with Phoenix.

Prior to making his pro debut, Samuelsson skated in three consecutive seasons in the Western Hockey League with the Edmonton Oil Kings from 2011-14. He served as an alternate captain during the 2013-14 season and helped lead Edmonton to a WHL championship after pacing the team in scoring with 23 points (8g, 15a) in 21 postseason contests. The forward then won the 2014 CHL Championship (Memorial Cup) with Edmonton and was named to the CHL Memorial Cup All-Star Team after finishing as the tournament's top scorer
