BACON BITS

LAST GAME:

» Dennis Gilbert pulled the Rockford IceHogs within one goal early in the third period, but Felix Girard potted a late tally and Eric Comrie made 33 saves to snuff the comeback and send the Manitoba Moose to a 3-1 win Saturday night at Bell MTS Place.

ICEHOGS VS. OPPONENT SERIES NOTES

- » The IceHogs have won seven of their last nine road games at Manitoba (including playoffs), going 7-2-0-0 in that span.
- » Rockford has been held to one goal in two of three games this season. Last season, the IceHogs scored 3+ goals in three of the four regular-season meetings and each of the four playoff games.
- » Only six IceHogs players have skated in each of the three games of this season's series (Carlsson, Ejdsell, Knott, Louis, Gilbert and Hillman).

GAME NOTES

THE TIDE OF LATE

The Rockford IceHogs have won just one of the last five games, but boast points in 11 of the last 16 contests since Jan. 25. Rockford is 10-5-0-1 over that 16-game stretch.

DIVISION COLLISION

Rockford enters Sunday two points in back of fourth place and a final playoff berth in the Central Division (63 points). Aside from Chicago (77 points), Grand Rapids (76 points) and Iowa (74 points), the remaining five teams in the Central are within five points of each other for the division's final playoff berth. Entering Friday, the Central is the only division in which each team has a .500-or-better record.

WE'RE OVER IT

The IceHogs have played into overtime in more than a third of their 59 games this season (21 of 60 games). Rockford leads the AHL in overtime wins with a 10-3 clip in such games. Over the last four years, only one team in the AHL has more overtime wins in a single season (Texas, 11-8 in OT in 2017-18).

THE SCHREDDER

Jordan Schroeder picked up an assist against Manitoba Saturday. Schroeder now has 10 points (6g, 4a) over his last eight games with three multi-point efforts in that span. The forward also has eight power-play goals this season, which is the most for an IceHogs skater since the 2012-13 season (Jeremy Morin, 12 PPGs).

PISTOL PETE

Peter Holland tallied an assist last night and has now logged a point in four of his first six games with Rockford. The forward enters Sunday tied for 10th in the AHL in scoring with 54 points in 58 total games between the IceHogs and Hartford.

LUKEWARM

Luke Johnson moved into second place for multi-point games among Rockford skaters this season with his eighth multi-point effort during Friday's win vs. Grand Rapids. He has 15 points (8g, 7a) over his last 15 games, including four multi-point efforts.

HIGHS AND LOWS

Rockford posted its second-lowest single-period shot total of 2018-19 in the first frame last night with just three SOGs against Manitoba. The IceHogs then responded with their highest single-period shot total of the year with 20 SOGs in the third frame. The 20 SOGs surpassed the previous mark of 18, which was most recently matched on in the second frame on Jan. 4 at Iowa.

ROAD WOES

The IceHogs have totaled just two goals over their last three road games and have been held to two or fewer goals in each of their last four road contests (winless in those last four road games). Overall, Rockford is averaging just 2.06 goals/game on the road with 64 tallies in 31 road games.

KING NAMED INTERIM HEAD COACH

- » Derek King was named interim head coach on Nov. 6, 2018 and has led the IceHogs to a 21-21-2-4 (.500) record behind the bench. King replaced Jeremy Colliton, who piloted the Hogs to a record of 46-31-5-6 (.585) from 2017-18 prior to being named head coach of the Chicago Blackhawks.

CAMPBELL HITS AHL'S 700-GAME MILESTONE

- » Defenseman Andrew Campbell became just the 74th player in the AHL's 82-year history to skate in 700 career AHL games on Feb. 9. He enters Sunday having skated in 708 AHL games during his 11-year career with Manchester, Portland, Toronto, Tucson and Rockford. He currently ranks:
