BACON BITS

LAST GAME:

» Dylan Sikura scored two goals, including the game-winner 3:21 into overtime, to help the Rockford IceHogs overcome a 3-1 deficit and sink the Milwaukee Admirals 4-3 Tuesday night at UWM-Panther Arena.

ICEHOGS VS. OPPONENT SERIES NOTES

- » The IceHogs were shut out in three straight games by the Wild from Nov. 7 - Jan. 4 for the first time in franchise history.
- » Rockford went 1-for-28 on the power play over the first seven games of the series but has since scored a power-play goal in each of the last two meetings. The Hogs are 2-for-6 on the PP over the last two games.
- » The Hogs have tallied three hat tricks against the Wild since the 2017-18 season. Matthew Highmore posted two hat tricks last season and Jacob Nilsson netted his first pro hat trick on Jan. 6 vs. Iowa.

GAME NOTES

DOWN THE STRETCH

The IceHogs have rebounded from a three-game skid to win four of the last six contests since March 30, including each of the last two games. The Hogs are also 19-11-1-1 with a .625 point percentage over the last 32 games after beginning the season at 16-18-3-5 with a .476 points percentage through games on Jan. 18.

WE'RE OVER IT

Rockford played into overtime for the 26th time during Tuesday's win at Milwaukee. The 26 OT games are the most in the AHL this season and the fourth-most among all AHL teams over the last five seasons behind only Rochester (29), Texas (28) and Utica (27) from the 2017-18 campaign. The IceHogs are 12-4 in OT which are tied for the most in the AHL this season (with Toronto) and ranks as the most in a single season for Rockford during the team's AHL history.

SAVE THE DATE

Collin Delia (.922) and Anton Forsberg (.920) enter the final week of the season ranked tied for first and third, respectively, in the AHL in save percentage. Since Rockford joined the AHL in 2007-08, no other team in the league has finished a season with two goaltenders ranked among the top three in save percentage. The closest (and most recent) team was Grand Rapids in 2015-16 when Tom McCollum (.923) and Jared Coreau (.922) finished third and tied for fourth.

FEELING BLUE

Lucas Carlsson posted his fifth multi-point effort of the season Tuesday with a goal and assist against the Admirals. Carlsson's five multi-point games are the most among current team blueliners and his 33 points, nine goals and 24 assists are all first among IceHogs defensemen this season. Further, Carlsson's 33 points are the most for a team blueliner in four years since Ville Pokka posted 45 points (10g, 35a) in 2015-16.

ONE AND NOT DONE

Each of Rockford's last three games have been decided by one goal and more than half of its 74 games (42, 56.8%) have been one-goal finishes entering Saturday. The IceHogs are 23-9-4-6 in games decided by a lone tally. Their 23 wins trail only Bridgeport (28) for the most wins in one-goal games in the AHL this year. The Hogs also enter Saturday with wins in five of their last six one-goal games since March 20.

DIALED IN DYLAN

Dylan Sikura has five points in four games since returning from Chicago last Tuesday. He is averaging .80 points per game this season with 35 points in 44 games, which is the best mark of all IceHogs rookies (at least 40 games) during the team's AHL affiliation. He also netted the game-winner in overtime Tuesday and his six game-winning goals this year are two more than any other IceHogs rookie during AHL affiliation.

HAPPY 30TH

Luke Johnson tallied an assist Tuesday for his 30th point this season. His 30 points in 51 games tie his career-high mark from 73 games last season.

KING NAMED INTERIM HEAD COACH

» Derek King was named interim head coach on Nov. 6, 2018 and has led the IceHogs to a 29-26-3-4 (.524) record behind the bench. King replaced Jeremy Colliton, who piloted the Hogs to a record of 46-31-5-6 (.585) from 2017-18 prior to being named head coach of the Chicago Blackhawks.

CAMPBELL HITS AHL'S 700-GAME MILESTONE

» Defenseman Andrew Campbell became just the 74th player in the AHL's 82-year history to skate in 700 career AHL games on Feb. 9. He enters today having skated in 717 AHL games during his 11-year career with Manchester, Portland, Toronto, Tucson and Rockford. He currently ranks:
